Educating Our Youth

Interest and participation in our Aviation Learning Center and other aviation focused school-based programs continues to grow. Participation reached a new high during 2022 and benefitted from a very special commitment from Southwest Airlines (SWA). November 2022 – March 2023, more than 700 Neighbor Island school students were provided with complimentary or reduced fare transportation to Oahu so that they might participate in Museum youth education programs. Opening our Aviation Learning Center to neighbor island youth was extremely exciting. With support from donors and friends, our Museum is committed to continuing this neighbor island initiative. Flight Adventures Featuring Biggest Little Airshow

After a three-year hiatus, Flight Adventures including the Biggest Little Air Show returned to Pearl Harbor Aviation Museum. Held as part of the Navy-supported Joint Base Summer Showcase & Expo, the event welcomed more than 8,700 people. Activities included a spectacular giant scale RC air show featuring locally and nationally acclaimed radio control pilots and a wide range of hands-on STEM activities for youth. The success of Flight Adventures underscored the Museum's vital role in inspiring the next generation of leaders.

Pearl Harbor Aviation Museum Scholarships

For many, finding the resources needed to pursue their dreams of flight can be daunting. Whether they seek to be a pilot, an aerospace engineer, a flight instructor, control tower operator, aviation mechanic or more, funding to support training and advanced education is critical. Since opening, a major part of our mission has been to inspire and empower the “air-mindedness” of the next generation. The first Scholarship fund, the Frank Der Yuen Aviation Scholarship, was established in 2007. Over the years, and with support from several donors and “fellow investors,” the Pearl Harbor Aviation Museum Scholarship Program has continued to grow. The launch of the For Love of Country Scholarship in 2021, funded by the Rick and Teresa Price Family as a condition in the sale of their Hawaii based company to Oil Changers, Inc., catapulted our initiative to new heights. The following six Scholarship Funds are now part of the Pearl Harbor Aviation Museum endowment:

For Love of Country Scholarship – established by The Price Family and Oil Changers, Inc., a \$1 million fund to advance Museum youth education programs and provide scholarship awards to help people across the country pursue their aviation dreams.

Brig Gen Robert B. and Judith Maguire Scholarship - established by Judith “Judy” Maguire to honor her late husband, Brig Gen Robert “Bob” B. Maguire, funds advance flight training.

Frank Der Yuen Aviation Scholarship – honoring the aviation legacy of Frank Der Yuen, funds support aviation education and training.

Col. Robert P. Moore Scholarship - established by Col. Robert P. Moore, funds support two awards: one to advance private pilot flight training and one to help certified flight instructors gain further training.

Admiral Ronald J. Hays Scholarship - established by friends and family members to honor the life, service and achievements of Admiral Hays, funds support flight training and aviation education.

Col. Robert F. Szul Scholarship - established by Gail Szul to honor the legacy of her husband, Bob Szul, funds help Hawaii girls attend Flight School summer program and supports school visits to the Museum.

As part of our 2023 Scholarship awards, 16 deserving recipients from around the country received life-changing awards ranging from \$800 - \$10,000, totaling over \$46,000 in scholarships. In addition, scholarships were awarded to four bright young ladies to attend our Flight School for Girls summer program. Deeply moved by the emotional statements of thanks by those who received these scholarships, Rick and Teresa Price, along with their son Christopher Price, announced a major gift during the 2023 Scholarship Award Ceremony. They committed \$100,000 to their endowed For Love of Country fund to amplify its impact. They also donated an additional \$50,000 to place into a special “pass through” fund to be awarded to selected applicants in the 2024 scholarship season. The Price Family’s personal commitment and overwhelming support will change the lives of many aspiring achievers around the country, every year.

Aviation Pathways

With support from the Ray Foundation and the State of Hawaii GIA, the Museum launched Aviation Pathways. The initiative provides for the development of two very definitive aviation career tracks:

- **Phase 1.** Helping Hawaii youth participate in flight training to achieve their private pilot's license, a first step in building a career as a pilot.
- **Phase 2.** Developing a training program to help Hawaii youth complete their aviation mechanics program, achieving their A&P license as part of their high school graduation.

During 2023, we were able to launch Phase 1 – selecting 20 Hawaii youth aged 16-21 to participate in the first cohort, receiving up to \$10,000 each to support flight training. Mentorship is provided to each selected student to support their achievement. Completing a personal achievement plan provides each youth the greatest opportunity to succeed. Ray Foundation support, matched by donors during the annual For Love of Country Gala Raise the Paddle, will help sustain this initiative through 2026.

CULTIVATING DEEP CONNECTIONS: EXPANDING VISITOR IMPACT

Dedicating our Douglas Dauntless SBD-2P

On December 7, 2023 the Douglas Dauntless SBD-2P BN2173, on display in Hangar 37, was formally dedicated in a special ceremony honoring the legacy of Lt. John Lendo, the WWII pilot who guided the aircraft to a water landing on February 18, 1944, escaping the cockpit as the aircraft sank. A frigid 25-degree day in Chicago, the aircraft's carburetor froze up and the engine died. The aircraft's journey back to Pearl Harbor is a fascinating story, made possible by many organizations and individuals who recognize the significance of preserving our national history.

This SBD-2P has a glorious WWII history. Transported on the USS Yorktown from San Diego to Pearl Harbor, this SBD served in the Battle of the Coral Sea and provided training support at three mainland Naval Air Stations before crash landing

into Lake Michigan. It remained submerged until salvage operations, supported by Pearl Harbor Aviation Museum and donor Fred Turner, pulled it to the surface in 2000. In 2015, The National Naval Aviation Museum at Pensacola, owner of this historic asset, gained the help of the Kalamazoo Air Zoo and Restoration Center to restore this fabulous artifact. Full circle, it was tremendous to bring it back to Pearl Harbor.

Attending the 2023 dedication ceremony was Dr. Arthur Lendo, nephew of Lt. John Lendo, accompanied by his wife Donna Jean. Remarkably, Dr. Lendo shared that it was not until he heard the news story about the salvage of the aircraft from Lake Michigan that he learned about the service and sacrifice of his uncle, Lt. John Lendo. Dr. Lendo spoke of his uncle and the importance of his legacy, and a name plaque was placed near the cockpit of the aircraft, to commemorate the brave service of Lt. John Lendo.

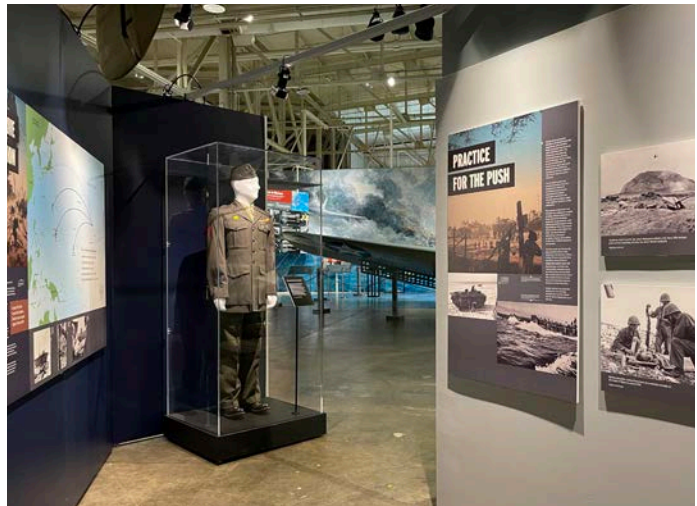
LAND • SEA • AIR MAUI IN WARTIME

New Exhibit: *LAND, SEA, AIR: Maui in Wartime*

On March 16, 2023, a blessing of the Museum's newest exhibit *LAND, SEA, AIR: Maui in Wartime*, was held in Hangar 37. Spearheaded by Maj Gen Edward "Rick" Richardson and made possible by an anonymous donor, the exhibit shares the overwhelming story of the pilot training that took place at Pu'unene field and throughout the island of Maui during WWII.

By one report, more than 20,000 WWII pilots were trained at the Pu'unene and Kahului Air Fields. Dropped off on Maui as their carriers continued to Pearl Harbor for re-supply, these pilots were briefed and schooled by battle-tested aircrews on the latest tactics and formations used by the Japanese. They also trained and collaborated with the 4th and 5th Marine Divisions also stationed on Maui and the Island of Hawaii in preparation for the landings at Saipan, Tinian, and Iwo Jima.

A central element of this exhibit shares the story of support extended by the von Tempsky family. Using their ranch, the family extended badly needed "R&R" (rest and relaxation) to pilots, Marines, soldiers, and others before they launched into battle. As a display of their gratitude and camaraderie, many of these service members signed a wall on the property. Though a great deal has changed, the famed wall of the von Tempsky ranch was preserved and moved to the National Naval Aviation Museum in Pensacola, Florida where it is now displayed, unavailable to Hawaii's residents and visitors. A rendering of the wall, along with many other stories that may have been forgotten by all but a few, are now shared at Pearl Harbor Aviation Museum.

FUELING OUR MISSION: THE POWER OF SUPPORT

America's WWII Aviation Battlefield

The opening of the Ford Island Control Tower in 2022 highlighted the significance of our historic battlefield site. The guided tour provides visitors with an in depth understanding of the “date which will live in infamy.” The ability to stand on the hallowed ground and enter the hangars that withstood the December 7, 1941 attack, and to ascend the control tower and view all of Pearl Harbor from this elevated point, is unique to our Museum. Throughout 2023, the Museum worked with Ralph Appelbaum & Associates to develop an elevated visitor experience. For many, whether visiting from local, national or international locations, the trip to Pearl Harbor is a pilgrimage – an opportunity to remember, honor and understand both the attack that thrust our nation into WWII and the response – the resilience and determination of our Greatest Generation.

At the conclusion of 2023, the Museum approved a conceptual plan that, over the next few years, will help develop a much more engaging and powerful experience, highlighting not only the attack but the months, years and decades that followed. No other aviation or WWII museum can offer the authentic aviation battlefield experience and emotional impact that the Pearl Harbor Aviation Museum provides. As a member and supporter, your help and support will be integral to achieving this vision.

A Vision Takes Flight: The Si Robin Foundation Challenge

In support of our vision, with a focus on fully restoring historic Hangar 79 to support expanded exhibits and educational programs, the Si Robin Foundation announced a \$5 million challenge. Details of the challenge and the vision will be unveiled in the coming year. Si Robin, himself an aviation industry icon, has been instrumental in supporting major restoration and youth education initiatives since the Museum opened in 2006. Most recently in 2021, his \$1 million Raise the Roof challenge helped prepare Hangar 79 for the planned exhibit and program expansion by repairing the roof, keeping the hangar interior dry and protected from the elements. We are deeply grateful to Si Robin for his continued generosity and support of the Museum's mission to educate and inspire future generations.

Choose Your Seat: Seats of Honor Campaign Opened to Public

The Museum launched its Seats of Honor campaign to the public in 2023, allowing supporters to leave a lasting legacy on the hallowed grounds of America's WWII aviation battlefield. During the November 9, 2023 dedication ceremony, many donors shared their stories with each other – a powerful exchange of personal remembrances that enrich our common history. Inspired by the event, it is our goal to collect the stories of those honored, to feature them on a special tribute page on our website, and to share them digitally in the Museum theater.

Each Seat of Honor donation allows us to celebrate the power of personal stories and serves as a reminder that history is not just about grand events and sweeping changes, but also about the individual journeys and contributions that collectively shape our world. We are honored to showcase these heroes and share their stories at our Museum. Funds raised from the Seats of Honor campaign will support our Museum and education initiatives in perpetuity.

The evening's special guests, our cherished WWII and Vietnam War veterans, were honored with a moving ceremonial procession that culminated in a heartfelt standing ovation, a testament to their courageous dedication to our country. This moment not only set the tone for the night but also ignited an outpouring of support for our mission. Among these distinguished veterans was LCDR Clyde "Cash" Barber, USN (Ret.), who bravely served as a PBY flight engineer during WWII. Cash and his squadron undertook numerous daring "Dumbo" missions, rescuing aviators and seamen in peril in the treacherous waters of the South Pacific. We were deeply honored to welcome Cash and our other veterans, whose legacies inspire us all.

Following an electric live auction that included many trips, experiences and a Jeep Gladiator, the Raise the Paddle appeal took center stage. With a Challenge Gift of \$125,000 from the Ray Foundation to support Aviation Pathways, a new Museum program designed to provide training and skills development to students interested in aviation, the generosity of our guests lifted spirits and opportunities for Hawaii youth, resulting in over \$300,000 raised to support this effort including another \$50,000 gift provided by the Ray Foundation.

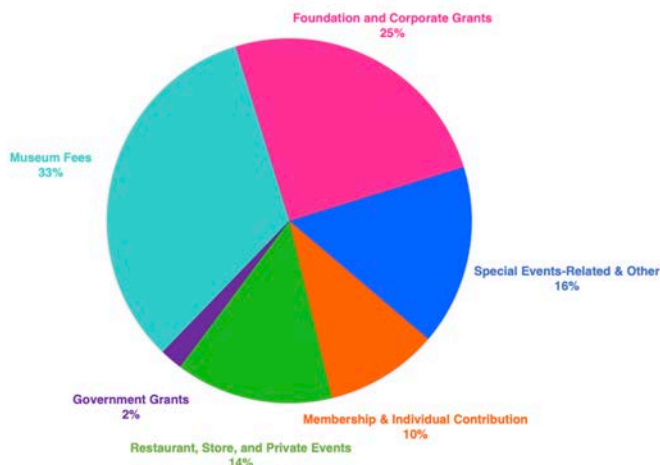

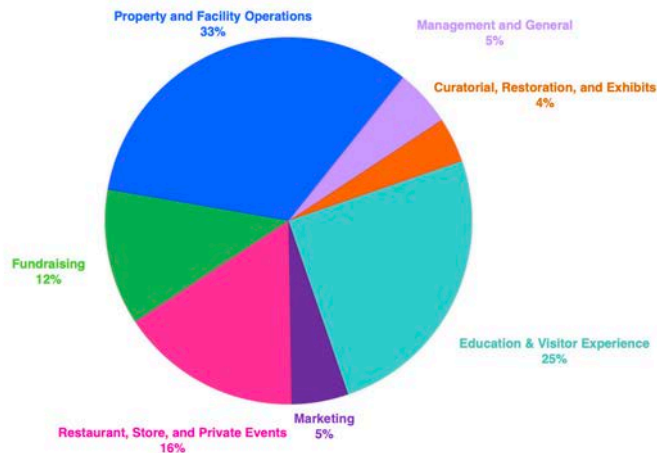

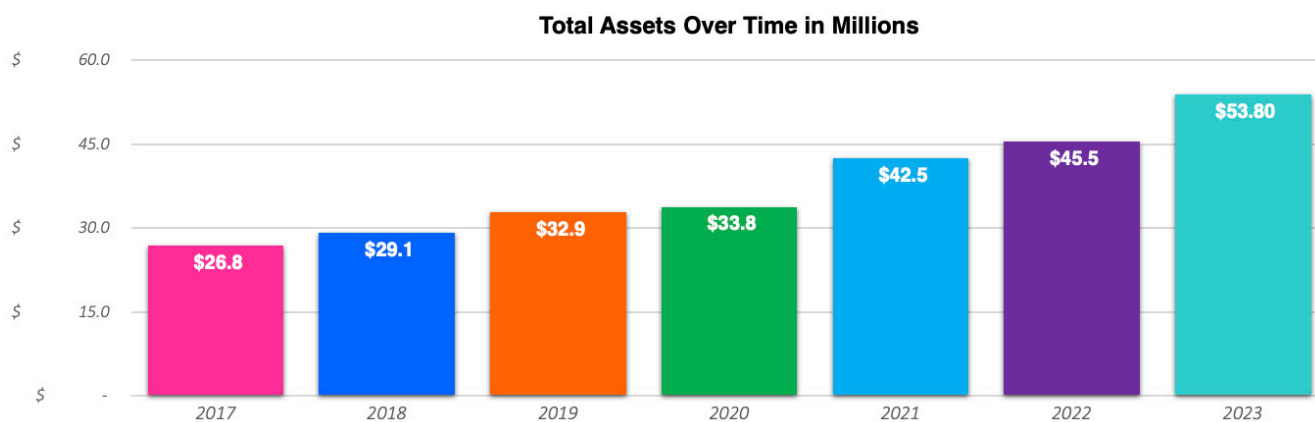
